# STRUCTURED INTERVIEW

# **WHAT**

A structured interview, also known as a standardized interview, is the most rigid type of conversation where researchers use a well-defined interview topic guide like a questionnaire, and ask the same questions in the same order to all interviewees.

## WHY

In qualitative research, a structured interview is usually used to test the credibility and reliability of research data.

# PHASE

Late stage of the Exploration phase

#### LENGTH

± 15 - 30 minutes



# **STEPS**

- Prior to the interview, prepare a list of closed-ended questions that could potentially reinforce or clarify previous findings.
- Use a vocabulary familiar to the group of people that will be interviewed to match their social background (e.g. age, educational level, social class, ethnicity, etc.).
- 3. Always ask the questions in the same order.
- 4. After collecting multiple responses you can analyze your findings and compare them with previous findings.
